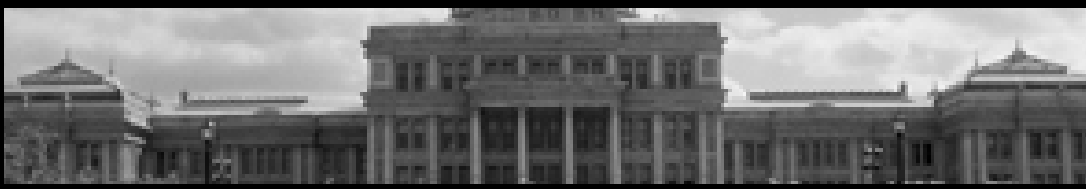

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

themselves all powers not clearly delegated by them to the Federal Government, as stated in the tenth amendment;

That the liberty is indivisible, and that political freedom will not long survive without religious and economic freedom;

That the free enterprise system, including a sound currency and the prohibition of government created inflation, is the only economic system consistent with the promotion of life, liberty and prosperity;

That the purpose of American foreign policy, clearly discerning our friends and enemies, should be, by means of a superior national defense and a strong free economy, to maintain the freedom of the people of America and, insofar as consistent with that purpose, to keep our country at peace.

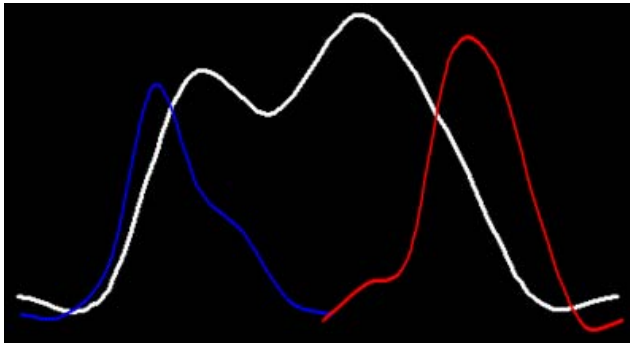

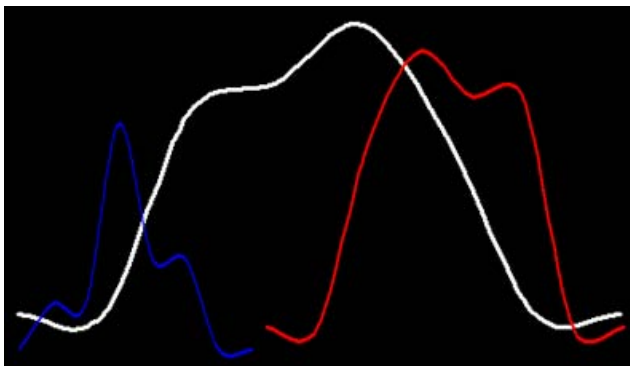

House of Representatives Partisan Perspective of Rating Distribution



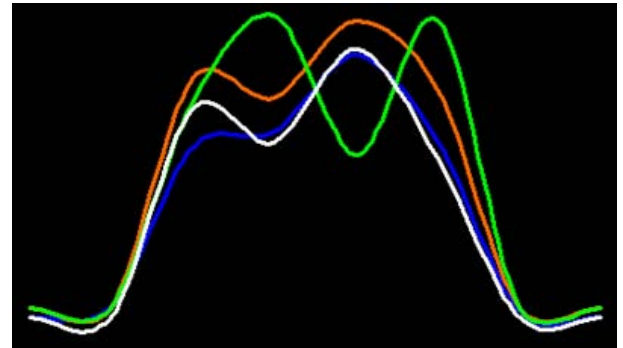
White – Full Chamber;

Senate Partisan Perspective of Rating Distribution



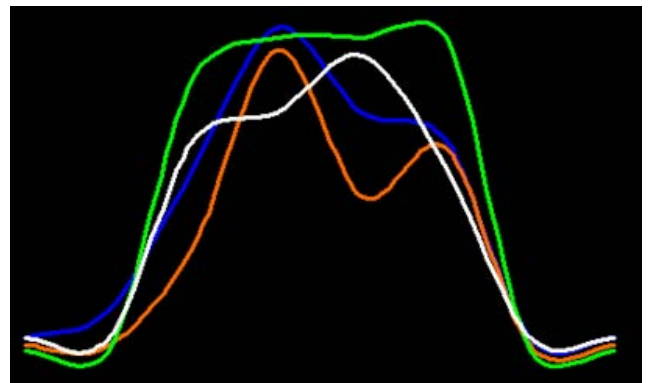
White – Full Chamber;
