Texas Young Americans for Freedom has prepared its "Guide to the 65th Texas Legislature" as a public service to the citizens of Texas so that they may be better informed as to the activities of the Legislature and specifically the activities of individual lawmakers.

In order to meet this objective, Texas Young Americans for Freedom has prepared a Legislative Rating Index (Page 2) of the recorded votes of the state legislators for the purpose of exposing the record to the public so that they can better understand the nature of their representation. Without such an index, citizens must cast their votes on the basis of campaign propaganda, party affiliation, and personal connections. YAF hopes this index will supplement these considerations and provide a different indication of the nature of a legislator.

The Rating Index, moreover, is not for the purpose of endorsement of any party. The Index applies equally to all legislators and is clearly for the public's information.

In addition, T.Y.A.F. has included an overview of the Legislature in the hope of providing the public with the proper perspective.

YAF's Guide to the 65th Legislature

The 65th Legislature

Texas Young Americans for Freedom initiated a "Legislative Action Program" Guring the 65th session of the Texas Legislature. The program was designed to promote responsibile legislation through lobbying, testimony, press conferences, surveys,

and petitions.

The best indications as to the effectiveness of our program are the voting records of individual legislators. Overall, the voting records indicate that the 65th Legislature was more conservative than the 64th Legislature. The average score of a Representative was 56 during the 65th session as compared to a score of 48 during the 64th session. The average score of a Senator was 61. In addition the 65th session consisted of 25 liberals, 19 moderate-liberals, 32 moderates, 42 moderate-conservatives, and 25 conservatives in the House, and 6 liberals, 11 moderates, 8 moderate-conservatives, and 6 conservatives in the Senate.

The best Representatives and Senators were those who consistently voted for fiscal responsibility, limited government, and individual freedom.

In the House the five best were Brad Wright, Jerry Donaldson, Bill Hollowell, Bob McFarland, and Fred Orr. The six worst were Sam Hudson, Paul Moreno, Irma Rangel, Senfronia Thompson, Craig Washington and Sarah Weddington.

In the Senate the 4 best were Tom Creighton, Ike Harris, Grant Jones and Walter Mengden. The 6

worst were Chet Brooks, Raul Longoria, Oscar Mauzy, Babe Schwartz, Carlos Truan and Lindon Williams.

Moreover, YAF has compiled a "Watch List" of Representatives and Senators who YAF believes do not represent their districts. They are Senators Sherman, Ogg, Andujar and Representatives Fox, Untermeyer, Benedict, Laney and Ribak.

Furthermore, Smith Gilley is the recipient of Texas YAF's "Tory" Award for conduct considered "most

unbecoming" of a Legislator.

Although much of the Legislature's time was taken up by trivial pieces of legislation, YAF has selected several bills it believes can best serve to gauge a legislator's philosophy in light of YAF's principles.

These bills are the basis of our Legislative Voting

Index.

In the index a "+" means that the legislator voted FOR the conservative position as determined by YAF. A "-" means that the legislator voted AGAINST the conservative position.

An X indicates an excused absence. No penalty is accessed for excused absences. A blank indicates a no show or a present, not voting. Blanks are counted the same as a negative vote.

The higher the score, the better the legislator promotes limited government and individual freedom.
