# STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

We, as **YOUNG CONSERVATIVES OF TEXAS**, dedicate ourselves to the preservation of the American Dream and a strong and free America. To this end, we hereby affirm:

That the free enterprise system, including a sound currency and the prohibition of government created inflation, is the only economic system consistent with the promotion of life, liberty and prosperity;

That the purpose of American foreign policy, clearly discerning our friends and enemies, should be, by means of a superior national defense and a strong free economy, to maintain the freedom of the people of America and, insofar as consistent with that purpose, to keep our country at peace.





# House of Representatives Partisan Perspective of Rating Distribution




White – Full Chamber; Red – Republicans; Blue – Democrats

# House of Representatives Historical Perspective of Rating Distributions




